

## **25 NOVEMBER THROUGH TO 10 DECEMBER**

- 1. The 2024 theme is Every 10 Minutes, a woman is killed. #NoExcuse. UNITE to End Violence against Women.
- **2.** Violence against women and girls remains one of the most prevalent human rights violations in the world.
- 3. In Australia, 58 women were killed in domestic homicide in 2023 (up from 35 in 2022 and 33 in 2021). In the first 6 months of 2024, at least 39 women have been killed by men's violence.
- **4.** On 28 April 2024, the Prime Minister declared a 'national crisis' of violence against women in Australia with one woman killed every four days.
- **5.** Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are disproportionately represented as victims of intimate partner homicide.
- **6.** Women are at increased risk of experiencing violence from an intimate partner during pregnancy.
- **7.** In Australia, intimate partner violence is the greatest health risk factor for women aged 25-44.
- **8.** Women with disability in Australia are twice as likely to have experienced sexual violence over their lifetime than women without disability.

- **9.** Globally, more than 5 women or girls are killed every hour by someone in their own family.
- **10.** In Australia, young women between 18-24 experience higher rates of physical and sexual violence than women in older age groups.
- **11.** Violence negatively affects women's physical and mental health and wellbeing at all stages of life.
- **12.** In Australia, domestic or family violence is the single largest driver of homelessness for women.
- **13.** More than 1 in 3 women experience gender-based violence during their lifetime.
- **14.** Globally, the estimated cost of violence against women is US\$1.5 trillion!
- **15.** Less than 40% of women who experience violence seek help.
- **16.** On 1 February 2023, new laws to provide 10 days paid Family and Domestic Violence Leave came into force after a strong campaign led by unions.
